Avengers endgame blu ray extended version

The number 3,000 will never be the same for us after watching Avengers: Endgame. Marvel Studios If you've seen Avengers: Endgame, you've probably cried and torn several times during the three-hour farce. Maybe you brought a box of tissues and cried the whole movie. - Yes, I understand. Marvel Cinematic Universe's 22 shows are a giant look back at the films before it. It's an emotional, nostalgic roller coaster for the fans. During each spotlight he was in, he smelled the room after a big scene near the end of the film. Now that the film has been for a while and made over \$1 billion dollars worldwide opening day, let's talk about these big moments. Insider breaks down the scenes that hit us hard from a few tears to a full ugly cry. Many of these moments have a more emotional burden on them if you preceded your Endgame watch with some or all of the 21 films that came before it. Tony Stark shares a brief moment of joy with Nebula at the beginning of the film and may not have realized how much it meant to blue evil, as he called it. The moment was supposed to be a cleaning pallet, but if you're familiar with Nebula history from the Guardians of the Galaxy franchise, they may have made you bleed. After Nebula won, Tony asked her if she had fun. The question surprises her, and Nebula slowly looks at the question before answering. Nebula spent so much of her life to be the perfect warrior for her father Thanos that fun was never on the agenda. Instead, the fun consists of a nebula, and Gamora fights each other over and over again. Every time Wanda loses to her sister (and that's every time), Thanos replaces some of it with machines. Tony Stark probably didn't realize how much he meant the nebula. The last time we saw Guardians of the Galaxy was with Tony and the Nebula. Disney/Marvel Studios Not all of our tears were sad. After seeing all the circles around Captain America, Tony and Thor, you're anxious to wonder who's going to show up. It's not until we see the Wizard of Bleecker Street, as Tony talks about him, on screen that we're sure it's the only successful timeline he's seen in Endgame. And when he arrives at the party, he's at the Guardians. Not only are we excited to see Groot again, but it's incredibly pleasing to see the rocket and nebula coming back. This ranks a little lower, because we were not very surprised that everyone came back. James Gunn returns for third film franchise and we feel quite confident about Doctor Strange 2, and Peter doesn't realize at this point how important he is to Tony. The above photo is one Tony sat in his kitchen. One of the film's sweetest moments is when Tony cut off Peter Parker to bring him into a huge hug. This is a man who, although he clearly sees tremendous potential in Peter, did not give the child a hug at the beginning of Spider-Man: Homecoming. He said they weren't there yet. When Tony returned to Earth, the first words he said to Cap were that he had lost the child, referring to Peter. That was before he even asked about Pepper Potts. He even kept a picture of Peter right next to his father, Howard, in his home five years later. After a second examination, this scene is more emotional because you know this is the first and last real moment between Tony and Peter in five years before Stark's death. When Peter saw Gamora, we knew it wasn't going to happen well. Marvel Star-Lord thought he'd never see his girlfriend again after Thanos killed her in Endgame. When he saw 2014 Gamora on the battlefield, it was an incredibly bitter moment. Maybe he thought there was some kind of mistake and that his Gamora was still alive. But when he learned that Gamora, who sees it, didn't remember it, it was one or two. While it was great to get Gamora back, it was devastating to realize he didn't know anything about his guardian family. Later, it was sadder to see Quill looking for a 2014 version of Gamora that was somewhere in the galaxy. Marvel Studios One of the most unexpected moments from Endgame came during the final battle, when Marvel Studios put most of its female characters together in a giant Avenger shoot. Okay, Wasp, Valkyrie, Gamora, Mantis, Pepper Potts, Scarlet Witch, and more put together to help Captain Marvel get Iron Gauntlet away from Thanos. For women who grew up with superheroes like Superman, Batman and Spider-Man dominating media, this is a great moment to see more than a handful of women together on screen for the first time in a single shot. For little girls growing up in an era where female superheroes are becoming ubiquitous, this is an uplifting moment of affirmation to see more than one version of a female character presented on screen. The moment was more emotional when you knew there was a direct call about the endless war scene with the now-deceased Black Widow. When The Thanos's Owl Of Midnight (Carrie Coe) tells Scarlett she's going to die alone during the Battle of Wakanda, The Black Widow comes from behind to say her friend isn't alone. She had Natasha and Oye to support it. At The End of the Game, when Peter Parker asks Captain Marvel how she'll probably handle the battlefield on her own, it's Okay who says Carol Danvers shouldn't do it alone. During a second viewing of Endgame, it's easier to see Black Widow's death. Marvel's Death/YouTube Black Widow was one of Endgame's biggest surprises. Since there is a standalone film in the so-called cheeky, many assumed it would be safe. When INSIDER interviewed fans of the Marvel 760 before the film's theatrical release, Black Widow was not among the characters fans thought would most likely die. Some 24% of those surveyed said they would be upset to see the character go. Aside from the shock of The Widow's death, this scene was conveyed by the emotion seen in Jeremy Renner's face. We just watched Hockey lose his whole family. We were forced to see him die his best friend and the kind of pain on his face was enough to get us in. We didn't put it higher for one main reason. If you haven't moved, Hogan must have suffocated you again when he asked Tony's little girl if she wanted something to eat. Morgan got a simple answer - cheeseburger, please. If that doesn't bring you tears in your eyes, you're going to want to look at another Iron Man watch. When Tony returned home after being detained by a terrorist organization, the billionaire told his driver, Happy, that he wanted a fast food cheeseburger. Like a father, like a daughter. If you remember the scene, you probably had trouble seeing through the tears you were trying to hide while Happy told Morgan and his father. Morgan, of course, was unmemorable. But not us. Your lips were shaking, fearing the worst that was to come. Marvel Studios From the moment Doctor Strange slowly stuck a finger and looked ominously at Tony, the tears began to build. Strange said there was one way to get everyone back, and Tony knew the ultimate sacrifice was going to be taken. You may not have gotten emotional until Tony showed that he was able to gain possession of the stones and master the Iron Gauntlet. When Tony said, Iron Man, and took on the full force of the stones, he was both divisive and equally upsetting. Yes, it was a call to Tony revealing his superhero identity to the world in 2008, but it was also a hint of the devastating moment that was coming. If Thanos and the Hulk could survive the power of Infinity and Iron Gauntlet wounds with only severe damage, there was no way Tony could bear it.
